See Gettysburg in a new light—this famous little town's part in World War II. In this **NEW** program offered by Historic Leadership Training, see the town and battlefield in the footsteps of the WWII leaders who lived, worked, and visited here.

Presidents Franklin D. Roosevelt, John F. Kennedy, and Dwight Eisenhower all found inspiration here. British Prime Minister Winston Churchill, intrigued

by the American Civil War, visited numerous times and wrote eloquently about the Battle of Gettysburg. Military heroes Bernard Montgomery of Great Britain and Charles de Gaulle of France visited here after the war to tour the area with their friend, Dwight D. Eisenhower, who had settled in Gettysburg.

During WWII, Gettysburg was the site of a Navy map-making office, a German prisonerof-war camp, and a psychological warfare training camp.

The Gettysburg National Cemetery dedicated by President Abraham Lincoln in 1863, is today the final resting place of 1,600 veterans of World War II. Hear the stories of those killed in combat at Pearl Harbor, the D-Day invasion, Battle of the Bulge, Okinawa, and Guadalcanal.


Honesty: A Key to Building Trust
